History Minor Requirements

The minor in History consists of a total of **six courses (or 24 credit hours)**, including:

- A minimum of **one** course from each of **two** chronological periods: pre-1800 and post-1800.
- A minimum of **one** course from at least **two** of the following geographical areas: Africa, Asia and the Pacific, Europe, Latin America, the Middle East, the United States.
- A minimum of **four** courses (or 16 credit hours) taken from department faculty; no more than two courses (or 8 credit hours) may come from AP credit, IB credit, transfer courses, study abroad courses, or cross-listed courses taught by faculty members not associated with the department of history.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Advanced Placement credit will be granted for scores of five on the American history, European history, or world history exams. This credit is elective credit and may not be used to satisfy the geographical or chronological distribution requirements in the major or minor OR to satisfy the focus requirement in the major.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

International Baccalaureate credit will be granted should a higher-level exam score of six or better be received. No credit is granted for subsidiary level exams. This credit is elective credit and may not be used to satisfy the geographical or chronological distribution requirements in the major or minor OR to satisfy the focus requirement in the major.

Note: No more than two courses taken outside the department can be counted toward the minor. This includes study abroad courses, cross-listed courses taught by faculty not formally associated with the department of history, and no more than a combined total of four elective credit hours (the equivalent of one course) for AP and IB exams.
