Zionism and Its Discontents

Course Description

This course will explore the emergence and developments of Zionist ideologies in the19th and 20th centuries, from precursors such as Baruch Spinoza and Moses Hess to classic theorists such as Leo Pinsker, Theodor Herzl, Ahad Ha-Am, Martin Buber, and Rav Kook.

We will then turn to consider a number of recent explorations of Zionism in practice Peter Beinart, Ruth Wisse, as well as Jewish and Palestinian critics of the Zionist project. Along the way, we will consider Zionism's attempt to forge a "new Jew" as well as the nature of Jewish power
