Some Preliminary Information:

Aims: Stage Management is a class that aims to give students interested in working backstage in the management field the tools and knowledge to become effective stage managers. The class is tailored to the demands and the specific functioning of Todd Theatre and the UR International Theatre Program, though we hope that the basic lessons learned will be applicable to any stage management situation. The class consists of a once weekly lecture, and additional work on one or both productions being produced in Todd Theatre.

Attendance: Attending class is mandatory. Participating in production work is also required.

Time Commitment: During the course of the semester you will work on one production as an Assistant Stage Manager. You will be required to be at between 3-5 rehearsals per week (the amount will depend on the nature of the production and the number of stage managers working). Rehearsals are generally scheduled Tue-Fri: 7-11pm; Sat: 10am-1pm & 2-5pm; Sun: 11am-2pm & 3-6pm (all rehearsal times are subject to change). Additionally, you will be required to attend:

- all run-throughs (and frequently run throughs of individual acts)
- the Designer's Run
- all Tech and Dress rehearsals
- all performances

Reading Material: The course's principal textbook is an in-house publication, *The Todd Theatre Stage Manager's Handbook*, which you will be given at the beginning of the semester. Additional readings might be provided or requested.

Other Reading: The reading of the *Todd Theatre Emergency Handbook* is also required. You need to have read this by your first Tech rehearsal. Once you have read this you need to sign an Emergency Handbook Release Form,

Quizzes/Exams: There may well be one or more quizzes/exams which cover material covered in both the handbook and in class. The Quizzes will count approximately 25% of the overall class grade.

Your grade will be determined by your quiz scores, your in-class participation, and—most importantly—the practical application of the work covered in class which you don on productions. Initiative, foresight, and diligence will all be rewarded.
