Julie Covach, Director, U of R Chamber Singers

Julie Covach holds a master's degree in keyboard performance and choral conducting from the University of Michigan, and bachelor's degrees in music education and psychology. She taught public school music for many years and now teaches at the University of Rochester Department of Music, where she directs the Chamber Singers, accompanies the Men's Glee Club, and teaches aural skills classes. Julie is a familiar face to local theatregoers, having recently served as musical director and conductor of Pittsford Musicals' Next to Normal, Webster Theatre Guild's Fiddler on the Roof, and Rochester Lyric Opera's You're Gonna Love Tomorrow.

Harold F. McAulliffe, Conductor, U of R Men's Glee Club

Harold McAulliffe's commitment to excellence has permeated every moment of his 48 year career as a professional educator, performer and conductor.

Mr. McAulliffe has organized and conducted multiple choral and instrumental ensembles, area festivals and musical theater productions. His choral expertise is requested each holiday season when he trains the Holiday Pops Festival choir for Rochester Philharmonic Pops conductor Jeff Tyzik. Equally successful as a tenor soloist, Mr. McAulliffe has appeared with major symphonies and choral societies around the United States and performed as a soloist in a number of European countries. He also appeared in a series of concerts across America promoting the Summer Olympics in Barcelona.

For the majority of his career, Mr. McAulliffe has been a leader in the Rochester music community, promoting the arts on a variety of corporate and He has served, or is serving, on the boards of Young county boards. Audiences of Rochester, the Rochester Philharmonic Youth Orchestra, Rotary Club of Pittsford, Vice President of the Pittsford District Retired Teacher's Association, and KEEP, the Pittsford Central Schools Foundation. Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra has also honored him as the Vocal Music Educator of the year. He has served for over 44 years as Musical Director for Pittsford Musicals, Inc., a community theater organization of which he was a co-founder and that has given over a quarter million dollars in scholarships to local students pursuing careers in the arts. This past Spring he directed "A Little Night Music", his 50th show as Musical Director/Conductor for Pittsford Musicals. He retired after 40 years of service in June 2007 from the Pittsford Central School District, having served as teacher, District Instructional Leader for Music, and Director of the Pittsford Summer Enrichment Institute.

Harold now teaches at the University of Rochester as conductor of the Men's Glee Club. He continues to travel the country, adjudicating choral festivals and appearing as a guest soloist.

Thomas Green, Director, U of R Gospel Choir

Mr. Green is a native of Rochester, New York. A diversified professional with an entrepreneurial spirit and proven ability to succeed, Mr. Green is a Christian who characterizes himself as a servant-leader. The servant-leader is servant first. This leadership style begins with the natural feeling that one wants to serve first.

Mr. Green has been a faithful member of Mt. Vernon Baptist Church since 1982, where he currently serves as the Minister of Music. He has also served as church pianist, director and music coordinator and has traveled with the church to Atlanta, Tennessee and Detroit. During his tenure as Youth Choir Director, Mr. Green has led the youth choir in travelling ministry-through-song to places such as Cleveland, Ohio; Wilmington, Delaware; Lexington, Kentucky; Washington D.C and Akron, Ohio. His passion is singing, praising and glorifying the Lord through song and is very dedicated and fully committed to his music ministry, always putting God first in all that he does. Mr. Green has been honored to sing for the Mayor of the City of Rochester's Inaugural Celebration (1993) and Unsung Hero's Programs (2000).

Mr. Green earned a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science from the State University College at Brockport and a Master of Science in Strategic Leadership from Roberts Wesleyan College. He also holds the distinguished Project Management Professional Certification from the Project Management Institute, is a graduate of the Lucy E. Campbell Music Workshop, National Baptist Convention and has studied music at the State University College at Brockport and Hochstein School of Music.

Mr. Green is married to Dr. Shirley J.A. Green, and they are the proud parents of two children; Courtney Denise, 2012 graduate of Clarkson University and currently a graduate student at the University of Newcastle in Newcastle, Australia, and Thomas Terrell, Jr., currently a Senior at St. Bonaventure University.
