Note that, in addition to PSC 200 or PSC 205, students may satisfy this requirement with ECO 230, ECO 231W, PSY/CSP 211, STT 211, STT 212, STT 213, STT 214, or any other course in statistics, or if they have received a score of 4 or 5 on the Advanced Placement exam in Statistics. Note that students who do not use PSC 200 or PSC 205 to satisfy their Techniques of Analysis requirement are permitted only two other courses in their allied field, so at least nine courses for the major are in PSC/IR.

Of these 7:

- No more than 3 are associated courses (for list see the Department website)
- No more than 3 are transfer courses
  - Courses taken abroad must be approved by a PSC advisor
  - Courses taken abroad (except PSC/IR 397) are considered transfers
- Up to (but no more than) 3 are from an allied field
  - All 3 are from one field (or exception granted by a PSC advisor)
  - Any courses in ECO, HIS, or PHL are acceptable (other fields with approval)
  - No more than 1 is at an introductory level
- One of the PSC/IR courses is a W course (202W counts as the other required W course)
- No more than 4 introductory courses altogether
